

Three tied at the top in Division One race

WITH six matches now completed in the Bolton Mixed Tennis League, the promotion races are beginning to take shape across all six divisions, **writes Hattie Morley.**

In Division One, Markland Hill A lead the way on 13 points, edging Holcombe Brook A into second on set difference after both sides recorded four wins, one defeat and one abandoned fixture. Worsley A are also on 13 points and remain firmly in contention, with just three sets separating the top three. Chorley A sit fourth on 10 points and will be hoping to close the gap in the second half of the season, while DL Nautago A are still searching for their first points.

Division Two has been dominated by Hawkshaw A, who have won all six of their matches to open up a commanding six-point lead at the top. Bradshaw A occupy second place on 12 points, while Holcombe Brook B are third on 10. At the other end of the table, Lostock B remain without a victory and sit bottom with one point.

The race for promotion in Division Three could hardly be closer. Chorley B lead the standings on 13 points, but Tyldesley A, Holcombe Brook C and Lostock C are all just three points behind on 10. DL Nautago C also remain in the hunt on nine points and boast the division's best set difference (+14), suggesting there is still plenty to play for in the weeks ahead.

In Division Four, Roe Green A and Eagley are locked together on 13 points after matching records of four wins, one defeat and one abandoned fixture. Roe Green hold top spot thanks to a hugely impressive +27 set difference. Elton Vale remain well placed in third on 10 points, while DL Nautago D prop up the table with four points.

Division Five sees Holcombe Brook D emerge as the early promotion favourites. They are unbeaten, with five wins and one abandoned match giving them 16 points and a healthy three-point cushion over Meadow Hill and Lostock D, who are tied on 13 points. Tyldesley B remain within touching distance on 10 points, but Markland Hill D are still looking for their first points of the campaign.

Finally, Division Six promises an exciting finish, with three teams level on 13 points. Roe Green B lead courtesy of a superior set difference, while Holcombe Brook E and Markland Hill E are breathing down their necks. Lostock E are only one point further back on 12 after winning four of their six matches, making this one of the closest promotion battles in the league. At the foot of the table, Walmer C are still without a win.
